

How long can the national cotton reserve be preserved





Overview

Freeze items that cannot be dried within 48 hours and consult a conservator.

*FSA is accepting Continuous CRP offers on a first-come, first-served basis for its second batching period from June 7, 2025, through July 18, 2025. However, should allotted CRP acreage remain available following the July 18 deadline, FSA will accept continuous CRP offers from interested landowners. Articles may be made of a specific textile (cotton, linen, wool, silk, synthetic), or a composite of many, and can include threads, buttons and fasteners, and decorative attachments, with varying potential for permanence and durability, depending how it was constructed, worn, and used. Whenever a national marketing quota is proclaimed under section 1342 of this title, the Secretary shall determine and proclaim a national acreage allotment for the crop of cotton to be produced in the next calendar year. This year, some new adjustments have been made to the detailed rules for cotton reserve rotation compared with previous years.
